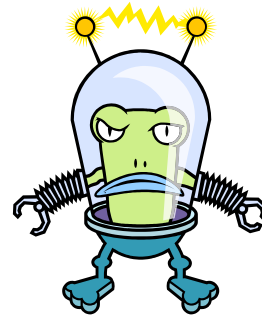

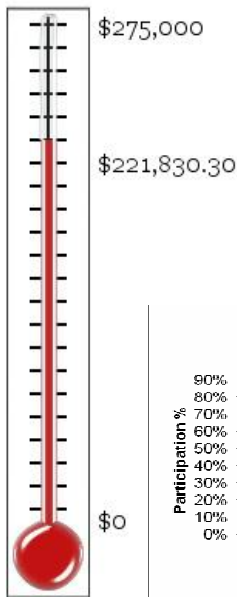
KID SHAKESPEARE SUMMER CLASSES

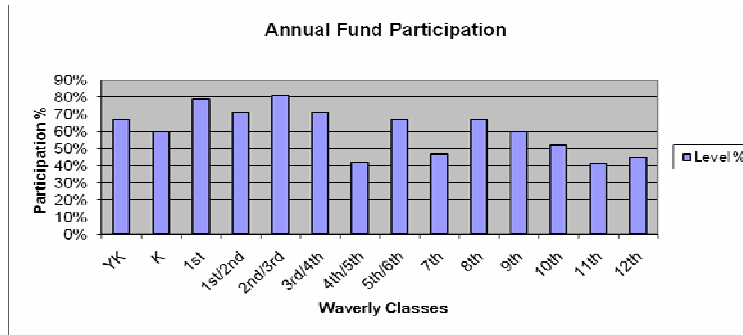
